Italian scientists have created the first full genetic map of Arabica coffee, the most popular type of coffee in the world. Arabica makes up about 60% of global coffee production and is known for its smooth taste. The study was done by researchers at the University of Padua and other Italian institutions. They spent several years collecting and analyzing thousands of DNA samples from Arabica plants. The scientists say this map is like a "blueprint" that shows all the genetic information of the plant. Why is this important? Coffee farmers often face problems such as plant diseases, rising temperatures, and changing rainfall. These factors can reduce the quality and amount of coffee beans produced. With the new DNA map, researchers can now identify which genes control taste, strength, and resistance to disease. This knowledge may help in developing new coffee plants that are healthier and more resilient. Arabica coffee is grown mainly in countries like Brazil, Ethiopia, and Colombia. The study focused on genetics, since Arabica is

Milan, one of Italy's busiest cities, is preparing new rules to control late-night eating. City officials have proposed a ban on selling takeaway ice cream, pizza, and other street food between 12:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. in several central districts. The plan follows hundreds of complaints from residents who say crowds of people disturb their sleep, especially in summer. According to the city council, noise levels in some neighborhoods regularly rise above 65 decibels, which is far higher than the recommended night-time limit of 55 decibels set

by the World Health Organization. The mayor explained that the measure is not an attack on Italian food, but a way to balance the rights of tourists and locals. "Nobody wants to ban ice cream," he said, "but thousands of people eating on the streets at 2 a.m. make it impossible for families to rest." Business owners are worried. Milan has more than 1,200 gelaterie (ice cream shops) and 400 pizzerias that often stay open past midnight. Owners argue that the ban will reduce sales by up to 20%, especially during June and July, when the city welcomes almost 6 million visitors. Supporters believe the plan will improve quality of life and make nightlife safer. They also note that similar restrictions already exist in parts of Rome and Florence. The city council will vote on the proposal later this month. If passed, the new rules could begin in June 2024, just before the peak tourist season.
